Lineworkers are ranked as some of the 10 most dangerous jobs in the country.





SREC's Board of Directors is essential to the success of the co-op. Directors attend monthly meetings to discuss issues and make decisions on behalf of the members. Their responsibilities include mitigating risk, setting rates, understanding power supply, stragetic planning, financial decision making, promoting the cooperative business model, gaining insights on political and environmental impacts, and meeting member expectations.

The elected representatives of SREC's Board of Directors are accountable to the membership and this year, three of those nine seats are set for election. The seats up for election this year are District 5 - the towns of Canisteo, Jasper, Troupsburg, and Woodhull currently represented by Gerald Chase Jr.; District 7 - the towns of Addison, Erwin, Corning, Tuscarora, and Lindley currently represented by Robert V. Nichols; and District 8 - Cattaraugus County currently represented by Randy



Stankey.

The nominating committee will select candidates for each of these three districts at their Nominating Committee meeting in June. If you

Member Disclosure Consent Form

The Federal Trade Comission (FTC) requires many businesses and organizations to implement an identity theft prevention program in their day-to-day business operations. Steuben Rural Electric Cooperative adheres to the FTC's Red Flags Rule to protect our members' information. The data privacy of our members is very important to us, and you may be asked to provide additional information and identification when you make inquiries on your account.

A member may complete an Member **Disclosure Consent** form to allow Steuben Rural Electric to give account information to anyone other than the member themselves. The authorized user is permitted to make inquiries on the account which they are authorized on. An authorized user can inquire about the balance or pay on the account. He or she is not authorized to start/stop service, change account information (such as mailing address), not entitled to unretired capital credits, nor is he/she financially responsbile for the account.



5 WAYS TO **SAVE THIS SUMMER**

When summer temperatures rise, so do our energy bills. Here are a few ways you can reduce energy use and grow your summer savings.

- Raise your thermostat. The smaller the difference between the indoor and outdoor temp, the more you'll save.
- 2. Install window coverings like blinds or light-blocking curtains to prevent indoor heat gain during the day.

3. Seal leaks with caulk and weatherstripping around windows and exterior doors. Air leaks force your air conditioner to work harder and run longer than necessary.

4. Run ceiling fans for additional cooling but turn them off when you leave the room.

5. Lower your water heater thermostat to 120 degrees to reduce standby heat loss.

Spring is here and there's never been a better time to get outside and enjoy the fresh air. Perhaps you're making plans for a new garden or a lawn makeover. However you're planning to revamp your backyard oasis, remember to keep safety in mind for all projects—especially those that require digging near underground utility lines.

Most of us never think about the electric. gas, water and other utility lines buried below the ground, but hitting one of these lines while digging is not the reminder you'll want-trust us! Steuben Rural Electric Cooperative reminds all members who are planning a digging project to call 811 at least three business days before you start. Or you can submit a request online by visiting www.udigny.org. 811 is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.


