Director Candidates for Election 2025-2028



James R. McCormick District 1 - Wayland, Cohocton, Fremont, Avoca, Hornellsville, Hartsville, Greenwood, W. Union

Mr. McCormick and his wife, Karen, reside on their farm in Greenwood, New York. He has been a Cooperative member for 52 years and Director for 48 years and currently serves as President of the Steuben Rural Electric Board and Vice President of the New York State Rural Electric Cooperatives Association. Janice L. Hoad District 2 - Cameron, Howard

NOMINATIONS

Additional nominations can be made for Board seats using the following procedure (Bylaws, Article IV, Directors, Section 3, Nominations). Any fifteen (15) or more members acting together may make other nominations by petition not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the meeting, and the Cooperative shall post such nominations, under the direction of the Secretary of the Board of Directors, at the same place where the list of nominations made by the committee is posted. Under the direction of the Secretary of the Board of Directors, the Cooperative shall mail with notice of the meeting or separately, but a least seven (7) days before the date of the meeting, a statement of the number of directors to be elected and the names and addresses of the candidates, specifying separately the nomination made by petition, if any. Additional nominations made by petition shall be for the respective districts scheduled for election.

Director Qualifications

In order to be elected to the Board as a Director, candidates must meet the following qualifications (see Bylaws, Article IV, Directors, Section 2, Qualifications & Tenure). Directors shall be elected by ballot at each annual meeting of the members, by and from the members, to serve until the third succeeding annual meeting of the members or until their successor shall have been elected and shall have qualified. No person shall be eligible to become or remain a director or to hold any position of trust in the Cooperative who:

- Is not a member and bona fide resident of the district within the Cooperative for which the director was elected to serve;
- Is in any way employed by or financially interested in a competing enterprise or a business selling electric energy, equipment or supplies to the Co-op;
- Is an employee of the Cooperative or has been an employee of the Cooperative within five (5) years from the date of the annual meeting at which the nomination will come to a vote:
- Is unable to read, write and speak in the English language;
- Is not able to enter into a legally binding contract;
- Is a convicted felon;
- Who has had bills owed to the Cooperative delinquent for more than ninety (90) days within the past two (2) years.

Certification of the Nominating Committee

The Nominating Committee certified to the Board of Directors, as required by the Bylaws, they made a prudent effort to nominate at least two nominees from each district scheduled for election in 2025 and were able to find only one candidate willing to be nominated for the position of director from Districts 1, 2 and 9.

VOTING PROCEDURES

<u>Voting at the Meeting:</u> Elections are to fill three Board seats, District 1, 2 and 9 for a three-year term. You will receive an Official Voting Ballot when you register at the Annual Meeting. Ballots will be collected and tabulated during the business meeting. If you are unable to attend the meeting, you may vote by proxy.

Proxy Voting: If you are unable to attend this year's meeting, you may vote for candidates on the election slate by obtaining a proxy. A member may give their proxy only to another member, and no person may hold more than one (1) proxy at any meeting. The presence of a member at a meeting shall revoke a proxy theretofore executed by them self and such member shall be entitled to vote at such meeting in the same manner and with the same effect as if they had not executed a proxy.

<u>To Obtain a Proxy:</u> (1) Call the Bath Office at 607-776-4161 or 800-843-3414 and request a proxy. Please have your account number available when you call. The proxy will be mailed to you. (2) Apply at either the Bath or Cherry Creek Office in person. Only a member may apply in person and **ONLY THE MEMBER GIVING THE PROXY TO ANOTHER MEMBER MAY OBTAIN A PROXY.**


Step 1: From the SmartHub login screen, click on "Don't have an account? Register now."



Step 2: Enter the following information:






